STAGES OF CELLULAR RESPIRATION

GLYCOLYSIS

- THESE THREE-CARBON MOLECULES ARE FURTHER PROCESSED TO FORM PYRUVATE.
- DURING THIS PROCESS, ATP AND NADH ARE PRODUCED.

GLYCOLYSIS DOES NOT REQUIRE OXYGEN, MAKING IT AN ANAEROBIC PROCESS. THIS FEATURE ALLOWS ORGANISMS TO GENERATE ENERGY EVEN IN LOW-OXYGEN ENVIRONMENTS.

KREBS CYCLE

THE KREBS CYCLE, ALSO KNOWN AS THE CITRIC ACID CYCLE OR TRICARBOXYLIC ACID CYCLE (TCA), TAKES PLACE IN THE MITOCHONDRIA. THIS CYCLE FURTHER PROCESSES PYRUVATE INTO CARBON DIOXIDE WHILE PRODUCING ENERGY-RICH MOLECULES. THE KEY STEPS OF THE KREBS CYCLE INCLUDE:

- ACETYL-CoA ENTERS THE CYCLE AND COMBINES WITH OXALOACETATE TO FORM CITRATE.
- CITRATE UNDERGOES A SERIES OF TRANSFORMATIONS, RELEASING CARBON DIOXIDE AND GENERATING NADH AND FADH₂.
- THE CYCLE REGENERATES OXALOACETATE, ALLOWING IT TO CONTINUE THE PROCESS.

EACH TURN OF THE KREBS CYCLE PRODUCES ONE ATP MOLECULE, IN ADDITION TO SEVERAL NADH AND FADH₂ MOLECULES, WHICH ARE CRUCIAL FOR THE NEXT STAGE OF CELLULAR RESPIRATION.

OXIDATIVE PHOSPHORYLATION

OXIDATIVE PHOSPHORYLATION OCCURS IN THE INNER MITOCHONDRIAL MEMBRANE AND INVOLVES THE ELECTRON TRANSPORT CHAIN (ETC) AND CHEMIOSMOSIS. THIS FINAL STAGE OF CELLULAR RESPIRATION IS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE MAJORITY OF ATP PRODUCTION. HERE'S HOW IT WORKS:

- NADH AND FADH₂ DONATE ELECTRONS TO THE ELECTRON TRANSPORT CHAIN.
- AS ELECTRONS MOVE THROUGH THE CHAIN, ENERGY IS RELEASED AND USED TO PUMP PROTONS ACROSS THE INNER MEMBRANE, CREATING A PROTON GRADIENT.
- PROTONS FLOW BACK INTO THE MITOCHONDRIAL MATRIX THROUGH ATP SYNTHASE, DRIVING THE SYNTHESIS OF ATP.
- OXYGEN SERVES AS THE FINAL ELECTRON ACCEPTOR, FORMING WATER.

OXIDATIVE PHOSPHORYLATION IS AN AEROBIC PROCESS AND PRODUCES APPROXIMATELY 28-34 ATP MOLECULES PER GLUCOSE MOLECULE, MAKING IT THE MOST EFFICIENT STAGE OF CELLULAR RESPIRATION.

IMPORTANCE OF CELLULAR RESPIRATION
