INTRODUCTION TO DIATOM BIOLOGY

ANATOMY OF DIATOMS

FRUSTULE STRUCTURE

THE FRUSTULE SERVES MULTIPLE FUNCTIONS, INCLUDING PROTECTION AGAINST PREDATION AND PHYSICAL DAMAGE. THE SILICA COMPOSITION PROVIDES RIGIDITY, WHILE THE INTRICATE DESIGNS ON THE SURFACE CAN VARY WIDELY BETWEEN SPECIES. THESE PATTERNS NOT ONLY CONTRIBUTE TO THE IDENTIFICATION OF DIATOM SPECIES BUT ALSO INFLUENCE LIGHT ABSORPTION AND BUOYANCY.

CELLULAR COMPONENTS

IN ADDITION TO THE FRUSTULE, DIATOM CELLS CONTAIN VARIOUS ORGANELLES ESSENTIAL FOR THEIR SURVIVAL:

- **CHLOROPLASTS:** THESE ORGANELLES ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR PHOTOSYNTHESIS, ENABLING DIATOMS TO CONVERT SUNLIGHT INTO ENERGY.
- **NUCLEUS:** THE NUCLEUS CONTAINS GENETIC MATERIAL AND REGULATES CELLULAR ACTIVITIES.
- **VACUOLES:** THESE STRUCTURES HELP MAINTAIN OSMOTIC BALANCE AND STORE NUTRIENTS.
- **SILICA DEPOSITION VESICLES:** THESE ARE INVOLVED IN THE FORMATION OF THE FRUSTULE.

ECOLOGICAL ROLE OF DIATOMS

DIATOMS PLAY A VITAL ROLE IN AQUATIC ECOSYSTEMS AS PRIMARY PRODUCERS. THEY FORM THE BASE OF THE FOOD WEB IN MANY MARINE AND FRESHWATER ENVIRONMENTS, PROVIDING ENERGY FOR A WIDE RANGE OF ORGANISMS, INCLUDING ZOOPLANKTON, FISH, AND LARGER AQUATIC ANIMALS.

CONTRIBUTION TO PRIMARY PRODUCTION

THROUGH PHOTOSYNTHESIS, DIATOMS CONTRIBUTE SIGNIFICANTLY TO GLOBAL PRIMARY PRODUCTION. THEY ARE ESTIMATED TO PRODUCE ABOUT 20% OF THE EARTH'S OXYGEN, MAKING THEM ESSENTIAL FOR MAINTAINING ATMOSPHERIC BALANCE. THEIR ABILITY TO THRIVE IN VARIOUS ENVIRONMENTAL CONDITIONS ALLOWS THEM TO COLONIZE DIVERSE HABITATS, FROM COASTAL WATERS TO FRESHWATER LAKES.

BIOGEOCHEMICAL CYCLES

DIATOMS ALSO PLAY A CRUCIAL ROLE IN BIOGEOCHEMICAL CYCLES, PARTICULARLY THE CARBON CYCLE. WHEN DIATOMS DIE, THEIR SILICA FRUSTULES SINK TO THE OCEAN FLOOR, EFFECTIVELY SEQUESTERING CARBON AND CONTRIBUTING TO THE BIOLOGICAL CARBON PUMP. THIS PROCESS IS VITAL FOR REGULATING CLIMATE AND MAINTAINING THE HEALTH OF MARINE ECOSYSTEMS.

TAXONOMY AND DIVERSITY OF DIATOMS

THE TAXONOMY OF DIATOMS IS COMPLEX, WITH THOUSANDS OF SPECIES CLASSIFIED INTO VARIOUS GENERA AND FAMILIES. DIATOMS ARE PRIMARILY DIVIDED INTO TWO MAIN GROUPS BASED ON THEIR SYMMETRY:

- **CENTRIC DIATOMS:** THESE ARE RADIALY SYMMETRICAL AND TYPICALLY FOUND IN MARINE ENVIRONMENTS.
- **PENNATE DIATOMS:** THESE ARE BILATERALLY SYMMETRICAL AND CAN INHABIT BOTH FRESHWATER AND MARINE ECOSYSTEMS.

SPECIES DIVERSITY

DIATOMS EXHIBIT REMARKABLE DIVERSITY IN FORM AND FUNCTION, WITH ESTIMATES SUGGESTING THERE ARE OVER 100,000
