ZOOLOGY IS FOUNDATIONAL TO A NUMBER OF OTHER BIOLOGICAL SCIENCES, INCLUDING CONSERVATION, ECOLOGY, AND GENETICS.

CORE AREAS OF ZOOLOGY

CAREER PATHS

- **TAXONOMIST:** CLASSIFYING AND DESCRIBING NEW SPECIES OF ANIMALS.

EDUCATION AND SKILLS REQUIRED
