

EXTANT DEFINITION BIOLOGY

EXTANT DEFINITION BIOLOGY IS A TERM FREQUENTLY UTILIZED IN THE FIELD OF BIOLOGY TO DESCRIBE LIVING ORGANISMS THAT ARE CURRENTLY IN EXISTENCE. HISTORICAL CONTEXT OF EXTANT SPECIES

THE CLASSIFICATION OF ORGANISMS INTO EXTANT AND EXTINCT CATEGORIES HAS A RICH HISTORICAL BACKGROUND IN BIOLOGY. SIGNIFICANCE OF EXTANT ORGANISMS IN BIOLOGY

EACH OF THESE EXTANT SPECIES PLAYS A UNIQUE ROLE WITHIN THEIR RESPECTIVE ECOSYSTEMS, CONTRIBUTING TO FOOD WEBS, NUTRIENT CYCLING, AND HABITAT STABILITY.

EXTANT VS. EXTINCT: KEY DIFFERENCES
