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STRUCTURE OF THE PERIPHERAL NERVOUS SYSTEM

THE PERIPHERAL NERVOUS SYSTEM (PNS) IS COMPOSED OF NERVES AND GANGLIA OUTSIDE THE BRAIN AND SPINAL CORD. IT IS DIVIDED INTO TWO MAIN PARTS: THE SOMATIC NERVOUS SYSTEM AND THE AUTONOMIC NERVOUS SYSTEM. COMPONENTS OF THE PNS
