UNDERSTANDING CATIONS

CHARACTERISTICS OF CATIONS

CATIONS EXHIBIT SPECIFIC CHARACTERISTICS THAT DISTINGUISH THEM FROM ANIONS, WHICH ARE NEGATIVELY CHARGED IONS. SOME NOTABLE FEATURES OF CATIONS INCLUDE:
