NEUTRONS

NEUTRONS ARE NEUTRAL PARTICLES ALSO LOCATED IN THE NUCLEUS. THEY DO NOT CARRY ANY CHARGE BUT PLAY A CRUCIAL ROLE IN STABILIZING THE NUCLEUS. THE NUMBER OF NEUTRONS IN AN ATOM CAN VARY, LEADING TO THE FORMATION OF ISOTOPES. FOR INSTANCE, CARBON-12 HAS SIX NEUTRONS, WHILE CARBON-14 HAS EIGHT NEUTRONS. THE PRESENCE OF NEUTRONS AFFECTS THE STABILITY AND RADIOACTIVE PROPERTIES OF AN ATOM.

ELECTRONS

ELECTRONS ARE NEGATIVELY CHARGED PARTICLES THAT ORBIT THE NUCLEUS IN ELECTRON SHELLS. THEY ARE SIGNIFICANTLY LIGHTER THAN PROTONS AND NEUTRONS. THE ARRANGEMENT OF ELECTRONS AROUND THE NUCLEUS DETERMINES HOW AN ATOM WILL INTERACT CHEMICALLY WITH OTHER ATOMS. PROPERTIES OF SUBATOMIC PARTICLES

- **CHARGE:** PROTONS CARRY A POSITIVE CHARGE (+1), NEUTRONS HAVE NO CHARGE (0), AND ELECTRONS HAVE A NEGATIVE CHARGE (-1).
- **LOCATION:** PROTONS AND NEUTRONS ARE LOCATED IN THE NUCLEUS, WHILE ELECTRONS ARE FOUND IN ORBITAL SHELLS AROUND THE NUCLEUS.
- **ROLE IN ATOMIC STABILITY:** NEUTRONS HELP STABILIZE THE NUCLEUS, WHILE THE BALANCE BETWEEN PROTONS AND ELECTRONS DETERMINES THE ATOM'S CHARGE.

HISTORICAL CONTEXT

LATER, ERNEST RUTHERFORD'S GOLD FOIL EXPERIMENT IN 1909 REVEALED THE EXISTENCE OF THE NUCLEUS, LEADING TO THE PLANETARY MODEL OF THE ATOM. JAMES CHADWICK'S DISCOVERY OF THE NEUTRON IN 1932 FURTHER REFINED OUR UNDERSTANDING OF ATOMIC STRUCTURE.

FORCES ACTING ON SUBATOMIC PARTICLES

SUBATOMIC PARTICLES ARE GOVERNED BY FUNDAMENTAL FORCES THAT DICTATE THEIR INTERACTIONS. THE TWO PRIMARY

FORCES RELEVANT TO CHEMISTRY ARE THE ELECTROMAGNETIC FORCE AND THE STRONG NUCLEAR FORCE.

ELECTROMAGNETIC FORCE

THE ELECTROMAGNETIC FORCE IS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE ATTRACTION BETWEEN POSITIVELY CHARGED PROTONS AND NEGATIVELY CHARGED ELECTRONS. THIS FORCE KEEPS ELECTRONS IN ORBIT AROUND THE NUCLEUS, CONTRIBUTING TO THE OVERALL STABILITY OF THE ATOM.

STRONG NUCLEAR FORCE

THE STRONG NUCLEAR FORCE BINDS PROTONS AND NEUTRONS TOGETHER IN THE NUCLEUS, OVERCOMING THE REPULSIVE ELECTROMAGNETIC FORCE BETWEEN POSITIVELY CHARGED PROTONS. THIS FORCE IS CRITICAL FOR THE STABILITY OF HEAVIER ELEMENTS, WHICH REQUIRE MORE NEUTRONS TO MAINTAIN BALANCE IN THE NUCLEUS.
