THE FERMENTATION PROCESS

3. **MALOLACTIC FERMENTATION:** IN SOME WINES, PARTICULARLY REDS AND CERTAIN WHITES, A SECONDARY FERMENTATION OCCURS WHERE MALIC ACID IS CONVERTED INTO LACTIC ACID, SOFTENING THE WINE'S ACIDITY AND ADDING COMPLEXITY.

4. **RACKING:** AFTER FERMENTATION, THE WINE IS SEPARATED FROM THE SEDIMENT (LEES) THAT SETTLES AT THE BOTTOM, CLARIFYING THE WINE.

THIS ENTIRE PROCESS IS INFLUENCED BY VARIOUS ENVIRONMENTAL FACTORS, INCLUDING TEMPERATURE, WHICH CAN SIGNIFICANTLY AFFECT YEAST ACTIVITY AND THE FINAL FLAVOR PROFILE OF THE WINE. WINEMAKERS MUST CAREFULLY MONITOR THESE CONDITIONS TO ENSURE THE DESIRED OUTCOME.

THE ROLE OF ACIDS IN WINE

THE BALANCE OF THESE ACIDS IS VITAL, AS TOO MUCH ACIDITY CAN MAKE A WINE TASTE SHARP AND UNINVITING, WHILE TOO LITTLE CAN LEAD TO A FLAT AND BLAND PROFILE.

THE SIGNIFICANCE OF PHENOLIC COMPOUNDS

PHEOLIC COMPOUNDS ARE NATURAL CHEMICALS FOUND IN GRAPES THAT SIGNIFICANTLY INFLUENCE THE COLOR, FLAVOR, AND MOUTHFEEL OF WINE. THESE COMPOUNDS INCLUDE TANNINS, FLAVONOIDS, AND ANTHOCYANINS, WHICH HAVE VARIOUS ROLES IN WINEMAKING:

THE EXTRACTION OF PHENOLIC COMPOUNDS OCCURS PRIMARILY DURING MACERATION, WHERE GRAPE SKINS ARE LEFT IN CONTACT WITH THE JUICE. THE DURATION OF THIS CONTACT CAN DRAMATICALLY INFLUENCE THE WINE'S FINAL CHARACTERISTICS, WITH LONGER MACERATION TIMES TYPICALLY RESULTING IN RICHER FLAVORS AND DEEPER COLORS.

FACTORS INFLUENCING WINE CHEMISTRY
