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INTRODUCTION TO CEREBROSPINAL FLUID

- **SODIUM (Na^+):** VITAL FOR NERVE IMPULSE TRANSMISSION.
- **POTASSIUM (K^+):** IMPORTANT FOR CELLULAR FUNCTION AND MAINTAINING MEMBRANE POTENTIAL.
- **CHLORIDE (Cl^-):** INVOLVED IN MAINTAINING OSMOTIC PRESSURE.
- **CALCIUM (Ca^{2+}):** PLAYS A ROLE IN NEUROTRANSMITTER RELEASE AND NEURONAL EXCITABILITY.

PROTEINS

GLUCOSE
