CLASSIFICATION OF SALTS

3. BASED ON ORIGIN

- **NATURAL SALTS:** FOUND IN NATURE, SUCH AS TABLE SALT AND MINERAL SALTS.
- **SYNTHETIC SALTS:** CREATED THROUGH INDUSTRIAL PROCESSES OR LABORATORY REACTIONS.

PREPARATION METHODS FOR SALTS

ANOTHER METHOD INVOLVES THE EVAPORATION OF A SOLUTION CONTAINING DISSOLVED SALTS. AS THE SOLVENT EVAPORATES, THE SALTS CRYSTALLIZE OUT OF THE SOLUTION. THIS TECHNIQUE IS FREQUENTLY USED TO PRODUCE TABLE SALT FROM SEAWATER.

PROPERTIES OF SALTS

DIFFERENT SALTS EXHIBIT A RANGE OF PHYSICAL AND CHEMICAL PROPERTIES THAT ARE CRUCIAL FOR THEIR IDENTIFICATION AND APPLICATION. THESE PROPERTIES INCLUDE:

1. SOLUBILITY

THE SOLUBILITY OF A SALT IN WATER VARIES WIDELY DEPENDING ON ITS IONIC COMPOSITION. SOME SALTS ARE HIGHLY SOLUBLE, WHILE OTHERS ARE NEARLY INSOLUBLE.

2. MELTING AND BOILING POINTS

SALTS GENERALLY HAVE HIGH MELTING AND BOILING POINTS DUE TO THE STRONG IONIC BONDS BETWEEN THEIR CONSTITUENT IONS. THIS CHARACTERISTIC IS IMPORTANT FOR THEIR STABILITY UNDER HEAT.

3. CONDUCTIVITY

IN AQUEOUS SOLUTIONS, SALTS DISSOCIATE INTO IONS, ALLOWING THEM TO CONDUCT ELECTRICITY. THIS PROPERTY IS ESSENTIAL IN APPLICATIONS SUCH AS ELECTROLYSIS AND BATTERY TECHNOLOGY.

APPLICATIONS OF DIFFERENT SALTS
