UNDERSTANDING THE DISTANCE FORMULA

BASIC CONCEPT OF THE DISTANCE FORMULA

IN A TWO-DIMENSIONAL SPACE, THE DISTANCE (d) BETWEEN TWO POINTS $((x_1, y_1))$ AND $((x_2, y_2))$ CAN BE CALCULATED USING THE FORMULA:

$$D = \sqrt{(x_2 - x_1)^2 + (y_2 - y_1)^2}$$

FOR THREE-DIMENSIONAL SPACE, WHERE POINTS ARE REPRESENTED AS $((x_1, y_1, z_1))$ AND $((x_2, y_2, z_2))$, THE FORMULA EXTENDS TO:

$$D = \sqrt{(x_2 - x_1)^2 + (y_2 - y_1)^2 + (z_2 - z_1)^2}$$
