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DEFINITION OF INORGANIC CHEMISTRY

INORGANIC CHEMISTRY IS DEFINED AS THE BRANCH OF CHEMISTRY THAT FOCUSES ON THE PROPERTIES, COMPOSITION, AND BEHAVIOR OF INORGANIC COMPOUNDS. INORGANIC COMPOUNDS CAN BE CLASSIFIED INTO SEVERAL CATEGORIES, SUCH AS:

- **SALTS:** COMPOSED OF IONS HELD TOGETHER BY IONIC BONDS, SUCH AS SODIUM CHLORIDE.
- **METALS:** ELEMENTS THAT ARE TYPICALLY GOOD CONDUCTORS OF HEAT AND ELECTRICITY, INCLUDING IRON AND COPPER.
- **MINERALS:** NATURALLY OCCURRING INORGANIC SOLIDS, SUCH AS QUARTZ AND CALCITE.

THESE CATEGORIES ILLUSTRATE THE DIVERSITY OF INORGANIC CHEMISTRY, WHICH IS CRITICAL FOR UNDERSTANDING VARIOUS NATURAL AND SYNTHETIC PROCESSES.

HISTORICAL CONTEXT

THIS CLASSIFICATION ALLOWED FOR A DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF CHEMICAL BEHAVIOR AND REACTIVITY.

THE DEVELOPMENT OF VARIOUS THEORIES, SUCH AS VALENCE BOND THEORY AND MOLECULAR ORBITAL THEORY, FURTHER ADVANCED THE FIELD, PROVIDING EXPLANATIONS FOR THE BONDING AND STRUCTURE OF INORGANIC COMPOUNDS. AS RESEARCH PROGRESSED, INORGANIC CHEMISTRY EVOLVED INTO A SEPARATE DISCIPLINE, DISTINCT FROM ORGANIC CHEMISTRY, WHILE STILL MAINTAINING INTERDISCIPLINARY CONNECTIONS.
