ELIMINATION REACTIONS

ELIMINATION REACTIONS INVOLVE THE REMOVAL OF ELEMENTS FROM A MOLECULE, TYPICALLY RESULTING IN THE FORMATION OF A DOUBLE BOND. COMMON TYPES INCLUDE *E1* AND *E2* MECHANISMS.

- **E1 MECHANISM:** SIMILAR TO S_N1 , *E1* REACTIONS PROCEED VIA A TWO-STEP MECHANISM WHERE THE LEAVING GROUP FIRST DEPARTS, FORMING A CARBOCATION, FOLLOWED BY DEPROTONATION TO FORM A DOUBLE BOND.
- **E2 MECHANISM:** THE *E2* MECHANISM IS A CONCERTED PROCESS WHERE THE BASE REMOVES A PROTON WHILE THE LEAVING GROUP DEPARTS, RESULTING IN THE FORMATION OF A DOUBLE BOND.

ADDITION REACTIONS

ADDITION REACTIONS INVOLVE THE ADDITION OF ATOMS OR GROUPS TO A DOUBLE OR TRIPLE BOND. THESE REACTIONS CAN BE CATEGORIZED INTO VARIOUS TYPES, SUCH AS ELECTROPHILIC ADDITION AND NUCLEOPHILIC ADDITION.
