

SILVER MIRROR CHEMISTRY

CHEMICAL REACTIONS INVOLVED

THE CORE OF SILVER MIRROR CHEMISTRY LIES IN THE REDUCTION OF SILVER IONS (Ag^+) TO METALLIC SILVER (Ag). THIS REDUCTION CAN OCCUR THROUGH SEVERAL CHEMICAL PATHWAYS, DEPENDING ON THE REAGENTS AND CONDITIONS USED. THE MOST NOTABLE REACTIONS INCLUDE:

THIS EQUATION ILLUSTRATES HOW AN ALDEHYDE (RCHO) REDUCES THE SILVER IONS, LEADING TO THE FORMATION OF A SILVER MIRROR WHILE BEING OXIDIZED TO A CARBOXYLIC ACID (RCOOH).

METHODS OF SILVER MIRROR FORMATION
