2. NUCLEAR MAGNETIC RESONANCE (NMR) SPECTROSCOPY

NMR SPECTROSCOPY IS A POWERFUL TOOL FOR DETERMINING THE STRUCTURE OF ORGANIC COMPOUNDS. THIS TECHNIQUE EXPLOITS THE MAGNETIC PROPERTIES OF CERTAIN ATOMIC NUCLEI, MOST COMMONLY HYDROGEN AND CARBON. 3. ULTRAVIOLET-VISIBLE (UV-VIS) SPECTROSCOPY

UV-VIS SPECTROSCOPY MEASURES THE ABSORPTION OF ULTRAVIOLET OR VISIBLE LIGHT BY A SAMPLE. THIS TECHNIQUE IS PARTICULARLY USEFUL FOR STUDYING CONJUGATED SYSTEMS AND TRANSITION METAL COMPLEXES. 4. MASS SPECTROMETRY (MS)

MASS SPECTROMETRY, WHILE NOT A FORM OF SPECTROSCOPY IN THE TRADITIONAL SENSE, IS OFTEN COUPLED WITH SPECTROSCOPIC METHODS TO PROVIDE COMPREHENSIVE ANALYSIS OF ORGANIC COMPOUNDS. IN MASS SPECTROMETRY, MOLECULES ARE IONIZED AND FRAGMENTED, AND THE RESULTING IONS ARE SEPARATED BASED ON THEIR MASS-TO-CHARGE RATIO. THE MASS SPECTRUM GENERATED REVEALS THE MOLECULAR WEIGHT AND STRUCTURAL INFORMATION OF THE COMPOUND, WHICH IS ESSENTIAL FOR IDENTIFYING AND CHARACTERIZING ORGANIC MOLECULES.

APPLICATIONS OF SPECTROSCOPY IN ORGANIC CHEMISTRY
