UNDERSTANDING UNIT CONVERSIONS

COMMON UNIT CONVERSION PROBLEMS IN CHEMISTRY

MASS TO MOLES CONVERSION

THIS TYPE OF CONVERSION IS ESSENTIAL WHEN YOU NEED TO DETERMINE HOW MANY MOLES OF A SUBSTANCE YOU HAVE BASED ON ITS MASS. THE FORMULA USED IS:

$$\text{MOLES} = \text{MASS (g)} / \text{MOLAR MASS (g/mol)}$$

FOR EXAMPLE, IF YOU HAVE 18 GRAMS OF WATER (H_2O), YOU FIRST FIND THE MOLAR MASS OF WATER (APPROXIMATELY 18 g/mol), AND THEN YOU CAN CALCULATE THE MOLES:

$$\text{MOLES OF H}_2\text{O} = 18 \text{ g} / 18 \text{ g/mol} = 1 \text{ MOLE.}$$

VOLUME TO MOLES CONVERSION

IN THIS CONVERSION, YOU OFTEN DEAL WITH GASES OR SOLUTIONS. THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN VOLUME AND MOLES CAN BE EXPRESSED USING THE IDEAL GAS LAW OR MOLARITY. FOR GASES, AT STANDARD TEMPERATURE AND PRESSURE (STP), ONE MOLE OCCUPIES 22.4 LITERS. FOR SOLUTIONS, YOU USE MOLARITY:

$$\text{MOLES} = \text{MOLARITY (mol/L)} \times \text{VOLUME (L)}$$

TECHNIQUES FOR SOLVING UNIT CONVERSION PROBLEMS

TO EFFECTIVELY SOLVE UNIT CONVERSION PROBLEMS, SEVERAL TECHNIQUES CAN HELP STREAMLINE THE PROCESS. FAMILIARITY WITH THESE TECHNIQUES ENHANCES PROBLEM-SOLVING SKILLS AND BOOSTS CONFIDENCE IN TACKLING COMPLEX CONVERSIONS.

USING DIMENSIONAL ANALYSIS

DIMENSIONAL ANALYSIS IS A POWERFUL TOOL IN CHEMISTRY FOR UNIT CONVERSIONS. THIS METHOD INVOLVES MULTIPLYING THE QUANTITY BY CONVERSION FACTORS THAT CANCEL OUT THE UNITS YOU WANT TO ELIMINATE, LEADING TO THE DESIRED UNITS. FOR EXAMPLE:

IF YOU NEED TO CONVERT 50 GRAMS OF NaCl TO MOLES, YOU CAN SET IT UP AS FOLLOWS:

$$50 \text{ g NaCl} \times (1 \text{ mol NaCl} / 58.44 \text{ g NaCl}) = 0.855 \text{ mol NaCl}.$$

MEMORIZING KEY CONVERSION FACTORS

MEMORIZING ESSENTIAL CONVERSION FACTORS CAN SAVE TIME AND PREVENT MISTAKES. SOME KEY CONVERSION FACTORS INCLUDE:

- $1 \text{ MOLE} = 6.022 \times 10^{23} \text{ PARTICLES}$
- $1 \text{ L} = 1000 \text{ mL}$
- $1 \text{ ATM} = 101.3 \text{ kPa}$
- $1 \text{ }^{\circ}\text{C} = 273.15 \text{ K}$

$$\text{MOLES} = 25 \text{ g} / 40 \text{ g/mol} = 0.625 \text{ MOLES}.$$

PROBLEM 2: HOW MANY LITERS ARE IN 3.5 MOLES OF GAS AT STP?

SOLUTION:

USING THE CONVERSION FACTOR FOR GASES AT STP ($1 \text{ MOLE} = 22.4 \text{ L}$):

$$\text{VOLUME} = 3.5 \text{ MOLES} \times 22.4 \text{ L/mol} = 78.4 \text{ L}.$$

PROBLEM 3: CONVERT 250 mL OF A SOLUTION TO LITERS.

SOLUTION:

USING THE CONVERSION ($1 \text{ L} = 1000 \text{ mL}$):

$$\text{VOLUME} = 250 \text{ mL} \times (1 \text{ L} / 1000 \text{ mL}) = 0.250 \text{ L}.$$

Q: WHAT CONVERSION FACTOR WOULD I USE FOR TEMPERATURE CONVERSIONS?

A: FOR TEMPERATURE CONVERSIONS, TO CONVERT CELSIUS TO KELVIN, YOU USE THE CONVERSION FACTOR $K = ^\circ\text{C} + 273.15$. THIS ALLOWS FOR PROPER CONVERSION BETWEEN THE TWO TEMPERATURE SCALES.

Q: HOW DO I CONVERT VOLUME FROM MILLILITERS TO LITERS?

A: TO CONVERT VOLUME FROM MILLILITERS TO LITERS, USE THE CONVERSION FACTOR: $1 \text{ L} = 1000 \text{ mL}$. FOR EXAMPLE, TO CONVERT 500 mL TO LITERS, YOU WOULD CALCULATE $500 \text{ mL} \times (1 \text{ L} / 1000 \text{ mL}) = 0.5 \text{ L}$.
