- **GAS QUENCHING:** USES INERT GASES, SUCH AS NITROGEN, TO COOL MATERIALS IN A CONTROLLED ATMOSPHERE.

EACH METHOD HAS ITS ADVANTAGES AND DISADVANTAGES, AND THE SELECTION DEPENDS ON THE DESIRED MECHANICAL PROPERTIES AND THE SPECIFIC MATERIALS INVOLVED. FOR INSTANCE, WATER QUENCHING IS EFFECTIVE FOR ACHIEVING HARDNESS BUT CAN LEAD TO DISTORTION, WHILE OIL QUENCHING PROVIDES A MORE CONTROLLED COOLING RATE.

QUENCHING IN METALLURGY
