

WHAT IS A RESIDUE IN CHEMISTRY

WHAT IS A RESIDUE IN CHEMISTRY IS A CONCEPT THAT REFERS TO THE REMAINING SUBSTANCE AFTER A CHEMICAL REACTION OR PROCESS HAS TAKEN PLACE. 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DEFINITION OF RESIDUE

WHEN A SOLUTION IS EVAPORATED, THE SOLUTE THAT DOES NOT EVAPORATE BECOMES A RESIDUE. AN EXAMPLE IS SALT LEFT BEHIND AFTER SEAWATER HAS EVAPORATED, WHICH IS A COMMON METHOD FOR SALT PRODUCTION.

3. CHEMICAL REACTION RESIDUES

IN A CHEMICAL REACTION, RESIDUES MAY INCLUDE UNREACTED REAGENTS OR BYPRODUCTS OF THE REACTION. FOR INSTANCE, IN THE SYNTHESIS OF ASPIRIN, ACETIC ACID MAY REMAIN AS A RESIDUE ALONGSIDE THE DESIRED PRODUCT.

IMPLICATIONS OF RESIDUES IN LABORATORY PRACTICES
