WHAT IS THE BALANCE OF PAYMENTS?

COMPONENTS OF THE BALANCE OF PAYMENTS

DEFICITS AND SURPLUSES

UNDERSTANDING DEFICITS AND SURPLUSES IN THE BALANCE OF PAYMENTS IS CRUCIAL FOR ANALYZING A COUNTRY'S ECONOMIC POSITION. CONVERSELY, A SURPLUS MAY LEAD TO LOWER INTEREST RATES TO DISCOURAGE EXCESSIVE CAPITAL INFLOW AND CURRENCY APPRECIATION.
