CLASSICAL ECONOMICS

KEY PRINCIPLES OF CLASSICAL ECONOMICS

NEOCLASSICAL ECONOMICS

NEOCLASSICAL ECONOMICS BUILT UPON THE FOUNDATIONS OF CLASSICAL ECONOMICS IN THE LATE 19TH CENTURY, INCORPORATING MATHEMATICAL METHODS TO ANALYZE ECONOMIC BEHAVIORS. THIS APPROACH EMPHASIZES THE ROLE OF CONSUMER PREFERENCES AND UTILITY MAXIMIZATION, ALONG WITH THE IMPORTANCE OF MARGINAL ANALYSIS.

KEYNESIAN ECONOMICS

DEVELOPED BY JOHN MAYNARD KEYNES DURING THE GREAT DEPRESSION IN THE 1930S, KEYNESIAN ECONOMICS CHALLENGED THE CLASSICAL VIEW BY ARGUING THAT AGGREGATE DEMAND DRIVES ECONOMIC GROWTH AND EMPLOYMENT. KEYNES POSITED THAT DURING ECONOMIC DOWNTURNS, INCREASED GOVERNMENT SPENDING IS NECESSARY TO STIMULATE DEMAND AND PULL ECONOMIES OUT OF RECESSION.

FUNDAMENTAL TENETS OF KEYNESIAN ECONOMICS

KEYNESIAN ECONOMICS EMPHASIZES SEVERAL FUNDAMENTAL TENETS:

- **AGGREGATE DEMAND:** ECONOMIC ACTIVITY IS DETERMINED BY THE TOTAL SPENDING IN THE ECONOMY, NOT JUST SUPPLY-SIDE FACTORS.

- **STICKY PRICES AND WAGES:** PRICES AND WAGES DO NOT ADJUST QUICKLY, WHICH CAN LEAD TO PROLONGED PERIODS OF UNEMPLOYMENT.

KEYNESIAN ECONOMICS HAS PLAYED A PIVOTAL ROLE IN SHAPING FISCAL POLICY AND RESPONSES TO ECONOMIC CRISES.

MONETARISM

MONETARISM, LED BY ECONOMIST MILTON FRIEDMAN, EMERGED AS A CRITIQUE OF KEYNESIAN ECONOMICS, PARTICULARLY FOCUSING ON THE ROLE OF MONEY SUPPLY IN THE ECONOMY. MONETARISTS ARGUE THAT CHANGES IN THE MONEY SUPPLY HAVE SIGNIFICANT AND PREDICTABLE EFFECTS ON NATIONAL OUTPUT AND INFLATION.

PRINCIPLES OF MONETARISM

MONETARISM IS DEFINED BY SEVERAL KEY PRINCIPLES:
