ACADEMIC PROGRAMS IN ECONOMICS

THE ECONOMICS DEPARTMENT AT WAYNE STATE UNIVERSITY OFFERS A RANGE OF ACADEMIC PROGRAMS DESIGNED TO CATER TO THE DIVERSE INTERESTS AND CAREER ASPIRATIONS OF ITS STUDENTS. THE PROGRAMS INCLUDE UNDERGRADUATE AND GRADUATE DEGREES, EACH WITH A ROBUST CURRICULUM THAT EMPHASIZES BOTH THEORETICAL AND PRACTICAL KNOWLEDGE.

UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMS

STUDENTS PURSUING AN UNDERGRADUATE DEGREE IN ECONOMICS AT WSU CAN CHOOSE FROM A BACHELOR OF ARTS (BA) OR A BACHELOR OF SCIENCE (BS) IN ECONOMICS. THE BA PROGRAM FOCUSES MORE ON LIBERAL ARTS AND SOCIAL SCIENCES, PROVIDING A BROAD UNDERSTANDING OF ECONOMIC PRINCIPLES IN RELATION TO SOCIETAL ISSUES. IN CONTRAST, THE BS PROGRAM EMPHASIZES QUANTITATIVE SKILLS AND ANALYTICAL METHODS, MAKING IT SUITABLE FOR STUDENTS INTERESTED IN DATA ANALYSIS AND RESEARCH.

- CORE COURSES: BOTH PROGRAMS REQUIRE CORE COURSES SUCH AS MICROECONOMICS, MACROECONOMICS, ECONOMETRICS, AND ECONOMIC THEORY.
- ELECTIVES: STUDENTS CAN SELECT ELECTIVES THAT ALIGN WITH THEIR INTERESTS, INCLUDING BEHAVIORAL ECONOMICS, INTERNATIONAL TRADE, AND PUBLIC ECONOMICS.
- CAPSTONE EXPERIENCE: A CAPSTONE PROJECT IS OFTEN REQUIRED, ALLOWING STUDENTS TO APPLY THEIR KNOWLEDGE TO REAL-WORLD ECONOMIC PROBLEMS.

GRADUATE PROGRAMS

FOR THOSE LOOKING TO ADVANCE THEIR EDUCATION, WSU OFFERS A MASTER OF ARTS (MA) AND A DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY (PHD) IN ECONOMICS. THE MA PROGRAM IS DESIGNED FOR STUDENTS WHO WANT TO DEEPEN THEIR UNDERSTANDING OF ECONOMIC THEORIES AND THEIR APPLICATIONS, WHILE THE PHD PROGRAM PREPARES CANDIDATES FOR ACADEMIC, RESEARCH, AND HIGH-LEVEL PROFESSIONAL POSITIONS.

GRADUATE STUDENTS ENGAGE IN RIGOROUS COURSEWORK AND ARE OFTEN INVOLVED IN RESEARCH THAT CONTRIBUTES TO THE ACADEMIC COMMUNITY AND INFORMS PUBLIC POLICY. THEY ALSO HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO TEACH UNDERGRADUATE COURSES, GAINING VALUABLE EXPERIENCE IN HIGHER EDUCATION.

RESEARCH OPPORTUNITIES

WAYNE STATE UNIVERSITY IS COMMITTED TO FOSTERING A RESEARCH-ORIENTED ENVIRONMENT, PARTICULARLY WITHIN ITS ECONOMICS DEPARTMENT. RESEARCH OPPORTUNITIES ARE ABUNDANT, ALLOWING STUDENTS AND FACULTY TO COLLABORATE ON PROJECTS THAT ADDRESS PRESSING ECONOMIC ISSUES.

- ENVIRONMENTAL ECONOMICS: EXPLORING THE ECONOMIC IMPLICATIONS OF ENVIRONMENTAL POLICIES AND SUSTAINABILITY.
