WHERE ECONOMICS STARTED IS A QUESTION THAT GOES BACK TO THE VERY FOUNDATIONS OF HUMAN SOCIETY. THIS SHIFT FROM SUBSISTENCE LIVING TO MORE STRUCTURED ECONOMIC EXCHANGES MARKED A SIGNIFICANT TURNING POINT IN THE EVOLUTION OF ECONOMIC PRACTICES. KEY FEATURES OF EARLY ECONOMIC SYSTEMS INCLUDE:

- BARTER SYSTEMS WHERE GOODS WERE EXCHANGED DIRECTLY.
- EMERGENCE OF AGRICULTURAL SURPLUS ALLOWING FOR TRADE AND SPECIALIZATION.

DEVELOPMENT OF CLASSICAL ECONOMICS

JOHN STUART MILL AND UTILITARIANISM

JOHN STUART MILL CONTRIBUTED TO ECONOMIC THOUGHT THROUGH HIS UTILITARIAN PERSPECTIVE, FOCUSING ON THE CONSEQUENCES OF ECONOMIC ACTIONS AND POLICIES. HIS WORK BRIDGED ECONOMICS AND MORAL PHILOSOPHY, EMPHASIZING THE IMPORTANCE OF IMPROVING SOCIETAL WELFARE.
