- THE P-NORM: A GENERALIZATION OF THE ABOVE, THE P-NORM FOR A POSITIVE REAL NUMBER  $p$  IS DEFINED AS  $\|v\|_p = (|v_1|^p + |v_2|^p + \dots + |v_n|^p)^{1/p}$ . THE L1, L2, AND L-INFINITY NORMS ARE SPECIAL CASES OF THE P-NORM.

## APPLICATIONS OF VECTOR NORMS

## DIVISIBILITY IN NUMBER THEORY: INDICATING MULTIPLES

SO, WHEN WE WRITE  $A \parallel B$ , IT'S GENERALLY UNDERSTOOD THAT  $A \neq 0$ .

## KEY PROPERTIES OF DIVISIBILITY

THE DIVISIBILITY RELATION, DENOTED BY **TWO VERTICAL LINES IN MATH** IN THIS CONTEXT, POSSESSES SEVERAL FUNDAMENTAL PROPERTIES THAT ARE EXTENSIVELY USED IN NUMBER THEORY PROOFS AND PROBLEM-SOLVING. UNDERSTANDING THESE PROPERTIES MAKES WORKING WITH DIVISIBILITY MUCH MORE STRAIGHTFORWARD:

- IF  $A \parallel B$  AND  $B \parallel A$ , THEN  $|A| = |B|$ . IF TWO INTEGERS DIVIDE EACH OTHER, THEIR ABSOLUTE VALUES MUST BE EQUAL.
- IF  $A \parallel B$  AND  $B \neq 0$ , THEN  $|A| \leq |B|$ . A PROPER DIVISOR OF A NON-ZERO INTEGER CANNOT BE LARGER IN MAGNITUDE THAN THE INTEGER ITSELF.

## ILLUSTRATIVE EXAMPLES OF DIVISIBILITY

LET'S EXPLORE SOME CONCRETE EXAMPLES TO SOLIDIFY OUR UNDERSTANDING OF DIVISIBILITY AS REPRESENTED BY **TWO VERTICAL LINES IN MATH**. CONSIDER THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE INTEGERS 3 AND 12. OFTEN JUST WRITTEN AS  $7 \nmid 15$ ). THE DEFINITION ALSO HIGHLIGHTS THAT ANY NON-ZERO INTEGER DIVIDES 0. FOR EXAMPLE,  $6 \parallel 0$  BECAUSE  $0 = 6 \times 0$ . HOWEVER, 0 DOES NOT DIVIDE ANY NON-ZERO INTEGER; YOU CAN'T FIND AN INTEGER  $k$  SUCH THAT  $5 = 0k$ .

## OTHER LESS COMMON USES OF TWO VERTICAL LINES

WHILE ABSOLUTE VALUE, VECTOR NORMS, AND DIVISIBILITY ARE THE MOST PROMINENT USES OF **TWO VERTICAL LINES IN MATH**, IT'S WORTH NOTING THAT THIS NOTATION, OR VERY SIMILAR VARIATIONS, CAN OCCASIONALLY APPEAR IN OTHER SPECIALIZED AREAS. A:  $|x|$  REPRESENTS THE ABSOLUTE VALUE OF A SCALAR (A SINGLE NUMBER) ' $x$ ', WHICH IS ITS DISTANCE FROM ZERO.  $\|v\|$  REPRESENTS THE NORM (MAGNITUDE OR LENGTH) OF A VECTOR ' $v$ '.

## Q: IS THE NOTATION ' $a \parallel b$ ' FOR DIVISIBILITY UNIVERSALLY ACCEPTED, OR ARE THERE ALTERNATIVE NOTATIONS?

A: THE NOTATION ' $a \parallel b$ ' IS A COMMON AND ACCEPTED WAY TO REPRESENT DIVISIBILITY IN NUMBER THEORY. HOWEVER, YOU MIGHT ALSO SEE ' $a \mid b$ ' OR EXPRESSIONS LIKE "A DIVIDES B" OR "B IS DIVISIBLE BY A." THE SYMBOL WITH A SLASH THROUGH IT, ' $a \nmid b$ ', IS USED TO INDICATE THAT ' $a$ ' DOES NOT DIVIDE ' $b$ '.

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
