DENSITY

DENSITY REFERS TO THE MASS OF A FLUID PER UNIT VOLUME. IT IS A CRITICAL PROPERTY THAT AFFECTS BUOYANCY AND PRESSURE. IN FLUID PHYSICS, UNDERSTANDING DENSITY HELPS IN CALCULATING HOW A FLUID WILL BEHAVE WHEN MIXED WITH

OTHER FLUIDS OR WHEN SUBJECTED TO VARIOUS FORCES. FOR EXAMPLE, OIL IS LESS DENSE THAN WATER, CAUSING IT TO FLOAT.

PRESSURE

PRESSURE IS DEFINED AS THE FORCE EXERTED PER UNIT AREA. IN FLUID PHYSICS, PRESSURE PLAYS A SIGNIFICANT ROLE IN HOW FLUIDS MOVE. IT IS ESSENTIAL IN UNDERSTANDING PHENOMENA SUCH AS LIFT IN AVIATION AND THE BEHAVIOR OF FLUIDS IN PIPES AND OPEN CHANNELS. PRESSURE CHANGES CAN LEAD TO VARIOUS FLUID DYNAMICS BEHAVIORS, INCLUDING TURBULENCE AND LAMINAR FLOW.

CLASSIFICATION OF FLUIDS

COMPRESSIBLE VS. INCOMPRESSIBLE FLUIDS

COMPRESSIBLE FLUIDS ARE THOSE WHOSE DENSITY CHANGES SIGNIFICANTLY WHEN SUBJECTED TO PRESSURE CHANGES, SUCH AS GASES. INCOMPRESSIBLE FLUIDS, LIKE MOST LIQUIDS, MAINTAIN A CONSTANT DENSITY REGARDLESS OF PRESSURE CHANGES. THIS DISTINCTION IS CRUCIAL IN VARIOUS APPLICATIONS, INCLUDING AERODYNAMICS AND HYDRAULICS.

NEWTONIAN VS. NON-NEWTONIAN FLUIDS

NEWTONIAN FLUIDS HAVE A CONSTANT VISCOSITY REGARDLESS OF THE APPLIED SHEAR RATE. WATER AND AIR ARE COMMON EXAMPLES. NON-NEWTONIAN FLUIDS, HOWEVER, HAVE A VISCOSITY THAT CHANGES BASED ON THE SHEAR RATE OR STRESS APPLIED. EXAMPLES INCLUDE KETCHUP AND CORNSTARCH MIXED WITH WATER. UNDERSTANDING THE DIFFERENCES BETWEEN THESE FLUID TYPES IS VITAL FOR PREDICTING HOW THEY WILL BEHAVE UNDER DIFFERENT FORCES.

FUNDAMENTAL LAWS OF FLUID DYNAMICS

FLUID DYNAMICS IS GOVERNED BY SEVERAL FUNDAMENTAL LAWS THAT DESCRIBE HOW FLUIDS BEHAVE IN MOTION. THESE LAWS FORM THE BACKBONE OF FLUID PHYSICS AND ARE USED IN VARIOUS APPLICATIONS.

BERNOULLI'S PRINCIPLE

BERNOULLI'S PRINCIPLE STATES THAT AN INCREASE IN THE SPEED OF A FLUID OCCURS SIMULTANEOUSLY WITH A DECREASE IN PRESSURE OR POTENTIAL ENERGY. THIS PRINCIPLE IS CRUCIAL IN EXPLAINING HOW AIRPLANES GENERATE LIFT AND WHY A SHOWER CURTAIN GETS SUCKED INWARD WHEN YOU TAKE A HOT SHOWER.

CONTINUITY EQUATION

THE CONTINUITY EQUATION IS BASED ON THE PRINCIPLE OF CONSERVATION OF MASS. IT STATES THAT THE MASS FLOW RATE MUST REMAIN CONSTANT FROM ONE CROSS-SECTION OF A PIPE TO ANOTHER. THIS LAW HELPS IN UNDERSTANDING HOW FLUIDS BEHAVE IN PIPING SYSTEMS AND IS ESSENTIAL FOR ENGINEERS DESIGNING FLUID TRANSPORT SYSTEMS.

NAVIER-STOKES EQUATIONS
