UNDERSTANDING RADIATION PHYSICS

RADIATION CAN BE CLASSIFIED INTO TWO MAIN CATEGORIES: IONIZING AND NON-IONIZING RADIATION. IONIZING RADIATION, WHICH INCLUDES X-RAYS AND GAMMA RAYS, IS THE TYPE USED IN RADIATION THERAPY BECAUSE IT HAS ENOUGH ENERGY TO IONIZE ATOMS AND MOLECULES, LEADING TO CELLULAR DAMAGE. THIS DAMAGE IS PARTICULARLY SIGNIFICANT IN RAPIDLY DIVIDING CANCER CELLS, MAKING RADIATION A POTENT WEAPON AGAINST TUMORS.

TYPES OF IONIZING RADIATION

IONIZING RADIATION CAN BE FURTHER CATEGORIZED INTO SEVERAL TYPES, EACH WITH UNIQUE PROPERTIES:

RADIATION INTERACTION WITH CELLS

UNDERSTANDING THESE INTERACTIONS IS CRUCIAL FOR OPTIMIZING RADIATION DOSES AND MINIMIZING SIDE EFFECTS.

TECHNIQUES IN RADIATION ONCOLOGY

RADIATION THERAPY EMPLOYS VARIOUS TECHNIQUES TO DELIVER PRECISE DOSES OF RADIATION TO TUMORS WHILE SPARING HEALTHY TISSUE. THE CHOICE OF TECHNIQUE DEPENDS ON THE TYPE, LOCATION, AND STAGE OF CANCER, AS WELL AS THE PATIENT'S OVERALL HEALTH.

EXTERNAL BEAM RADIATION THERAPY (EBRT)

EBRT IS ONE OF THE MOST COMMON METHODS OF DELIVERING RADIATION THERAPY. IT INVOLVES DIRECTING HIGH-ENERGY BEAMS FROM OUTSIDE THE BODY AT THE TUMOR. THIS TECHNIQUE IS FURTHER DIVIDED INTO:

BRACHYTHERAPY

BRACHYTHERAPY INVOLVES PLACING RADIOACTIVE SOURCES DIRECTLY INSIDE OR NEAR THE TUMOR. THIS TECHNIQUE ALLOWS FOR HIGH DOSES OF RADIATION TO REACH THE TUMOR WHILE MINIMIZING EXPOSURE TO SURROUNDING HEALTHY TISSUE. IT IS COMMONLY USED FOR PROSTATE, CERVICAL, AND BREAST CANCERS.

THE ROLE OF MEDICAL PHYSICISTS

MEDICAL PHYSICISTS PLAY A VITAL ROLE IN RADIATION ONCOLOGY, ENSURING THE SAFETY AND EFFECTIVENESS OF RADIATION TREATMENTS. THEY ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE FOLLOWING:

QUALITY ASSURANCE

TREATMENT PLANNING
