TIPS FOR EFFECTIVE STUDY AND REVIEW

UNDERSTANDING ANGULAR DISPLACEMENT AND VELOCITY

THE JOURNEY INTO ROTATIONAL MOTION BEGINS WITH UNDERSTANDING HOW OBJECTS ROTATE. UNLIKE LINEAR MOTION, WHERE WE TRACK DISPLACEMENT IN METERS, ROTATIONAL MOTION USES ANGLES. ANGULAR DISPLACEMENT, OFTEN DENOTED BY THE GREEK LETTER THETA (θ), MEASURES THE CHANGE IN ANGULAR POSITION OF AN OBJECT. IT'S TYPICALLY EXPRESSED IN RADIANS, THOUGH DEGREES ARE ALSO SOMETIMES USED. A FULL CIRCLE, FOR INSTANCE, IS 2π RADIANS OR 360 DEGREES. IMAGINE A FERRIS WHEEL; THE ANGLE IT ROTATES THROUGH FROM ITS STARTING POSITION TO A NEW POSITION IS ITS ANGULAR DISPLACEMENT. THIS FUNDAMENTAL CONCEPT IS THE BEDROCK UPON WHICH ALL OTHER ROTATIONAL CONCEPTS ARE BUILT, MUCH LIKE UNDERSTANDING HOW FAR A CAR HAS TRAVELED IS CRUCIAL FOR ANALYZING ITS LINEAR MOTION.

CLOSELY LINKED TO ANGULAR DISPLACEMENT IS ANGULAR VELOCITY (ω), WHICH DESCRIBES HOW QUICKLY AN OBJECT ROTATES. JUST AS LINEAR VELOCITY IS THE RATE OF CHANGE OF LINEAR DISPLACEMENT (DISTANCE OVER TIME), ANGULAR VELOCITY IS THE RATE OF CHANGE OF ANGULAR DISPLACEMENT OVER TIME. THE STANDARD UNIT FOR ANGULAR VELOCITY IS RADIANS PER SECOND (RAD/S). IF OUR FERRIS WHEEL COMPLETES A FULL ROTATION IN 60 SECONDS, ITS ANGULAR VELOCITY CAN BE CALCULATED. POSITIVE AND NEGATIVE SIGNS FOR ANGULAR VELOCITY INDICATE THE DIRECTION OF ROTATION – TYPICALLY COUNTER-CLOCKWISE IS POSITIVE AND CLOCKWISE IS NEGATIVE, SIMILAR TO HOW WE DEFINE POSITIVE AND NEGATIVE DIRECTIONS IN LINEAR MOTION.

CALCULATING ANGULAR VELOCITY

TO CALCULATE ANGULAR VELOCITY, WE USE THE FORMULA $\omega = \frac{\Delta \theta}{\Delta t}$, WHERE $\Delta \theta$ IS THE CHANGE IN ANGULAR DISPLACEMENT AND Δt IS THE TIME INTERVAL OVER WHICH THAT CHANGE OCCURS. FOR INSTANCE, IF A WHEEL TURNS THROUGH AN ANGLE OF 3π RADIANS IN 10 SECONDS, ITS AVERAGE ANGULAR VELOCITY WOULD BE $\frac{3\pi \text{ rad}}{10 \text{ s}} = 0.3\pi \text{ rad/s}$. THIS FORMULA IS ESSENTIAL FOR SOLVING MANY PROBLEMS FOUND IN PHYSICS UNIT 6 WORKSHEET 1.

IT'S ALSO IMPORTANT TO DISTINGUISH BETWEEN AVERAGE AND INSTANTANEOUS ANGULAR VELOCITY. AVERAGE ANGULAR VELOCITY GIVES YOU THE OVERALL RATE OF ROTATION OVER A PERIOD, WHILE INSTANTANEOUS ANGULAR VELOCITY IS THE RATE AT A SPECIFIC MOMENT IN TIME. FOR CONSTANT ANGULAR VELOCITY, THE AVERAGE AND INSTANTANEOUS VALUES ARE THE SAME. IF THE ROTATION IS ACCELERATING, THESE VALUES WILL DIFFER, AND CALCULUS IS OFTEN USED TO FIND THE INSTANTANEOUS VALUE.

EXPLORING ANGULAR ACCELERATION AND ITS IMPACT

JUST AS LINEAR MOTION CAN ACCELERATE, MEANING ITS VELOCITY CHANGES, SO TOO CAN ROTATIONAL MOTION. ANGULAR ACCELERATION (α) IS THE RATE AT WHICH ANGULAR VELOCITY CHANGES OVER TIME. IT'S MEASURED IN RADIANS PER SECOND SQUARED (rad/s^2). THINK ABOUT A SPINNING TOP; WHEN YOU FIRST GIVE IT A SPIN, ITS ANGULAR VELOCITY INCREASES. THIS INCREASE IS DUE TO ANGULAR ACCELERATION. WITHOUT IT, OBJECTS WOULD EITHER SPIN AT A CONSTANT SPEED OR NOT SPIN AT ALL, WHICH ISN'T VERY INTERESTING FOR PHYSICS PROBLEMS!

ANGULAR ACCELERATION IS CAUSED BY A NET EXTERNAL TORQUE, WHICH WE'LL DISCUSS IN DETAIL LATER. A CONSTANT ANGULAR ACCELERATION SIMPLIFIES CALCULATIONS SIGNIFICANTLY, ALLOWING US TO USE KINEMATIC EQUATIONS THAT ARE ANALOGOUS TO THOSE USED IN LINEAR MOTION. THESE EQUATIONS ARE FREQUENTLY TESTED IN THE CONTEXT OF PHYSICS UNIT 6 WORKSHEET 1 ANSWERS, SO MASTERING THEM IS CRUCIAL FOR SUCCESS.

ANALOGOUS KINEMATIC EQUATIONS

THE KINEMATIC EQUATIONS FOR CONSTANT ANGULAR ACCELERATION ARE DIRECT PARALLELS TO THEIR LINEAR COUNTERPARTS. THEY INCLUDE:

- $\omega_f = \omega_i + \alpha t$ (FINAL ANGULAR VELOCITY EQUALS INITIAL ANGULAR VELOCITY PLUS ANGULAR ACCELERATION TIMES TIME)
- $\Delta \theta = \omega_i t + \frac{1}{2} \alpha t^2$ (ANGULAR DISPLACEMENT EQUALS INITIAL ANGULAR VELOCITY TIMES TIME PLUS ONE-HALF TIMES ANGULAR ACCELERATION TIMES TIME SQUARED)
- $\omega_f^2 = \omega_i^2 + 2 \alpha \Delta \theta$ (THE SQUARE OF THE FINAL ANGULAR VELOCITY EQUALS THE SQUARE OF THE INITIAL ANGULAR VELOCITY PLUS TWICE THE ANGULAR ACCELERATION TIMES THE ANGULAR DISPLACEMENT)
- $\Delta \theta = \frac{1}{2} (\omega_i + \omega_f) t$ (ANGULAR DISPLACEMENT EQUALS THE AVERAGE ANGULAR VELOCITY TIMES TIME)

THESE EQUATIONS ARE YOUR BEST FRIENDS WHEN DEALING WITH PROBLEMS INVOLVING CHANGING ROTATIONAL SPEEDS. UNDERSTANDING WHEN AND HOW TO APPLY EACH ONE IS A KEY SKILL FOR SOLVING ROTATIONAL MOTION PROBLEMS, AND THEY ARE A COMMON FOCUS FOR THE PHYSICS UNIT 6 WORKSHEET 1.

DELVING INTO TORQUE AND ROTATIONAL INERTIA

NOW WE ARRIVE AT THE DRIVING FORCE BEHIND ROTATIONAL ACCELERATION: TORQUE. TORQUE (τ), OFTEN CALLED THE "TURNING EFFECT," IS THE ROTATIONAL EQUIVALENT OF FORCE. JUST AS A NET FORCE CAUSES AN OBJECT TO ACCELERATE LINEARLY, A NET TORQUE CAUSES AN OBJECT TO ACCELERATE ROTATIONALLY. TORQUE IS CALCULATED AS THE PRODUCT OF THE FORCE APPLIED AND THE PERPENDICULAR DISTANCE FROM THE PIVOT POINT (OR AXIS OF ROTATION) TO THE LINE OF ACTION OF THE FORCE. MATHEMATICALLY, $\tau = rF \sin \theta$, WHERE r IS THE DISTANCE FROM THE PIVOT, F IS THE MAGNITUDE OF THE FORCE, AND θ IS THE ANGLE BETWEEN THE FORCE VECTOR AND THE LEVER ARM VECTOR.

THE CONCEPT OF ROTATIONAL INERTIA, OR MOMENT OF INERTIA (I), IS THE ROTATIONAL EQUIVALENT OF MASS. IT'S A MEASURE OF AN OBJECT'S RESISTANCE TO CHANGES IN ITS ROTATIONAL MOTION. OBJECTS WITH LARGER MOMENTS OF INERTIA REQUIRE MORE TORQUE TO ACHIEVE THE SAME ANGULAR ACCELERATION AS OBJECTS WITH SMALLER MOMENTS OF INERTIA. THE MOMENT OF INERTIA DEPENDS NOT ONLY ON THE MASS OF THE OBJECT BUT ALSO ON HOW THAT MASS IS DISTRIBUTED RELATIVE TO THE AXIS OF ROTATION. A SOLID DISK HAS A DIFFERENT MOMENT OF INERTIA THAN A HOOP OF THE SAME MASS, EVEN THOUGH THEY HAVE THE SAME MASS, BECAUSE THE MASS IS DISTRIBUTED DIFFERENTLY.

NEWTON'S SECOND LAW FOR ROTATION

THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN TORQUE, ROTATIONAL INERTIA, AND ANGULAR ACCELERATION IS BEAUTIFULLY CAPTURED BY

NEWTON'S SECOND LAW FOR ROTATION: $\Sigma \tau = I \alpha$. THIS EQUATION IS FUNDAMENTAL TO UNDERSTANDING HOW OBJECTS ROTATE AND IS A CORNERSTONE OF THE PHYSICS UNIT 6 WORKSHEET 1. IT STATES THAT THE SUM OF ALL EXTERNAL TORQUES ACTING ON AN OBJECT IS EQUAL TO ITS MOMENT OF INERTIA MULTIPLIED BY ITS ANGULAR ACCELERATION. THIS LAW ALLOWS US TO PREDICT HOW AN OBJECT WILL ROTATE WHEN SUBJECTED TO VARIOUS FORCES, OR CONVERSELY, TO DETERMINE THE FORCES NEEDED TO ACHIEVE A DESIRED ROTATION.

CALCULATING THE MOMENT OF INERTIA FOR DIFFERENT SHAPES IS A COMMON TASK. FOR EXAMPLE, A THIN HOOP ROTATING ABOUT ITS CENTRAL AXIS HAS $I = MR^2$, WHILE A SOLID DISK HAS $I = \frac{1}{2}MR^2$. UNDERSTANDING THESE FORMULAS AND HOW TO APPLY THEM IS ESSENTIAL FOR SOLVING PROBLEMS ACCURATELY.

MASTERING ANGULAR MOMENTUM AND CONSERVATION LAWS

ANGULAR MOMENTUM (L) IS ANOTHER CRUCIAL CONCEPT IN ROTATIONAL DYNAMICS. IT'S THE ROTATIONAL EQUIVALENT OF LINEAR MOMENTUM AND IS DEFINED AS THE PRODUCT OF AN OBJECT'S MOMENT OF INERTIA AND ITS ANGULAR VELOCITY: $L = I\omega$. JUST AS LINEAR MOMENTUM IS A MEASURE OF AN OBJECT'S TENDENCY TO CONTINUE IN LINEAR MOTION, ANGULAR MOMENTUM DESCRIBES AN OBJECT'S TENDENCY TO CONTINUE IN ROTATIONAL MOTION. OBJECTS WITH LARGER ANGULAR MOMENTUM ARE HARDER TO STOP FROM ROTATING.

PERHAPS THE MOST PROFOUND PRINCIPLE RELATED TO ANGULAR MOMENTUM IS THE LAW OF CONSERVATION OF ANGULAR MOMENTUM. THIS LAW STATES THAT IN THE ABSENCE OF EXTERNAL TORQUES, THE TOTAL ANGULAR MOMENTUM OF A SYSTEM REMAINS CONSTANT. THIS PRINCIPLE IS INCREDIBLY POWERFUL AND HAS FAR-REACHING IMPLICATIONS, FROM THE SPINNING OF A FIGURE SKATER PULLING IN THEIR ARMS TO THE FORMATION OF GALAXIES. MANY PROBLEMS ON PHYSICS UNIT 6 WORKSHEET 1 WILL LIKELY TEST YOUR UNDERSTANDING OF THIS CONSERVATION LAW.

APPLICATIONS OF CONSERVATION OF ANGULAR MOMENTUM

CONSIDER A FIGURE SKATER SPINNING WITH THEIR ARMS EXTENDED. AS THEY PULL THEIR ARMS INWARD, THEIR MOMENT OF INERTIA (I) DECREASES. SINCE ANGULAR MOMENTUM ($L = I\omega$) MUST REMAIN CONSTANT (ASSUMING NEGLIGIBLE EXTERNAL TORQUES FROM FRICTION), THEIR ANGULAR VELOCITY (ω) MUST INCREASE. THIS IS WHY THEY SPIN FASTER. SIMILARLY, A DIVER TUCKS THEIR BODY TO REDUCE THEIR MOMENT OF INERTIA, ALLOWING THEM TO ROTATE MORE TIMES BEFORE HITTING THE WATER.

THIS CONSERVATION PRINCIPLE ALSO APPLIES TO SYSTEMS WITH MULTIPLE ROTATING BODIES. THE TOTAL ANGULAR MOMENTUM OF THE SYSTEM, WHICH IS THE VECTOR SUM OF THE INDIVIDUAL ANGULAR MOMENTA, WILL REMAIN CONSTANT IF NO NET EXTERNAL TORQUE ACTS UPON IT. UNDERSTANDING THESE SCENARIOS IS KEY TO MASTERING THE PROBLEMS PRESENTED IN THE WORKSHEET.

COMMON CHALLENGES AND PROBLEM-SOLVING STRATEGIES FOR UNIT 6, WORKSHEET 1

MANY STUDENTS FIND ROTATIONAL MOTION MORE CHALLENGING THAN LINEAR MOTION DUE TO THE INTRODUCTION OF NEW CONCEPTS LIKE TORQUE, MOMENT OF INERTIA, AND ANGULAR MOMENTUM, AS WELL AS THE NEED TO WORK WITH ANGLES AND RADIANS. A COMMON HURDLE IS CORRECTLY IDENTIFYING THE AXIS OF ROTATION AND CALCULATING THE LEVER ARM FOR TORQUE. ANOTHER FREQUENT MISTAKE IS CONFUSING LINEAR AND ROTATIONAL QUANTITIES OR APPLYING THE WRONG EQUATIONS. FOR INSTANCE, USING FORCE INSTEAD OF TORQUE, OR MASS INSTEAD OF MOMENT OF INERTIA.

TO EFFECTIVELY TACKLE PROBLEMS FROM PHYSICS UNIT 6 WORKSHEET 1, A SYSTEMATIC APPROACH IS ESSENTIAL. START BY DRAWING A CLEAR DIAGRAM OF THE SITUATION, LABELING ALL FORCES, DISTANCES, AND THE AXIS OF ROTATION. IDENTIFY THE KNOWN AND UNKNOWN VARIABLES. DETERMINE WHETHER THE PROBLEM INVOLVES CONSTANT ANGULAR ACCELERATION OR A CHANGING ONE. IF ACCELERATION IS CONSTANT, THE KINEMATIC EQUATIONS ARE YOUR GO-TO. IF NOT, YOU'LL LIKELY NEED TO USE TORQUE AND MOMENT OF INERTIA ($\Sigma \tau = I \alpha$) OR CONSERVATION LAWS. ALWAYS PAY CLOSE ATTENTION TO THE UNITS AND ENSURE CONSISTENCY, ESPECIALLY WITH RADIANS.

STEP-BY-STEP PROBLEM-SOLVING APPROACH

HERE'S A GENERAL STRATEGY THAT CAN HELP:

- READ THE PROBLEM CAREFULLY AND IDENTIFY THE PHYSICAL SITUATION.
- DRAW A FREE-BODY DIAGRAM AND A ROTATIONAL DIAGRAM, CLEARLY INDICATING THE AXIS OF ROTATION, FORCES, LEVER ARMS, AND DIRECTIONS OF MOTION.
- LIST ALL KNOWN AND UNKNOWN QUANTITIES.
- CHOOSE THE APPROPRIATE PHYSICAL PRINCIPLES AND EQUATIONS (KINEMATIC EQUATIONS, NEWTON'S SECOND LAW FOR ROTATION, CONSERVATION LAWS).
- SOLVE THE EQUATIONS SYSTEMATICALLY, PAYING ATTENTION TO SIGNS AND UNITS.
- CHECK YOUR ANSWER FOR REASONABLENESS AND ENSURE IT ADDRESSES THE QUESTION ASKED.

PRACTICING A VARIETY OF PROBLEMS IS THE MOST EFFECTIVE WAY TO BUILD CONFIDENCE AND PROFICIENCY. DON'T HESITATE TO REVISIT THE FUNDAMENTAL DEFINITIONS AND FORMULAS WHENEVER YOU FEEL UNSURE.

TIPS FOR EFFECTIVE STUDY AND REVIEW

TO TRULY MASTER THE CONCEPTS COVERED IN PHYSICS UNIT 6 WORKSHEET 1, CONSISTENT AND FOCUSED STUDY IS KEY. REGULARLY REVIEW YOUR NOTES AND THE TEXTBOOK MATERIAL. WORK THROUGH PRACTICE PROBLEMS, NOT JUST THOSE IN THE WORKSHEET, BUT ALSO THOSE FROM YOUR TEXTBOOK AND OTHER RELIABLE SOURCES. UNDERSTANDING THE 'WHY' BEHIND THE FORMULAS IS MORE IMPORTANT THAN SIMPLY MEMORIZING THEM. TRY TO EXPLAIN THE CONCEPTS IN YOUR OWN WORDS, AS IF YOU WERE TEACHING THEM TO SOMEONE ELSE. THIS ACTIVE RECALL PROCESS GREATLY ENHANCES RETENTION.

FORMING A STUDY GROUP CAN ALSO BE BENEFICIAL. DISCUSSING CHALLENGING PROBLEMS WITH PEERS CAN OFFER NEW PERSPECTIVES AND HELP IDENTIFY AREAS WHERE YOUR UNDERSTANDING MIGHT BE WEAK. WHEN YOU ENCOUNTER A PROBLEM YOU CAN'T SOLVE, DON'T GIVE UP IMMEDIATELY. TRY TO BREAK IT DOWN INTO SMALLER STEPS. IF YOU'RE STILL STUCK, CONSULT YOUR INSTRUCTOR OR A TUTOR FOR CLARIFICATION. THE GOAL ISN'T JUST TO FIND THE PHYSICS UNIT 6 WORKSHEET 1 ANSWERS, BUT TO DEVELOP A DEEP UNDERSTANDING THAT WILL SERVE YOU WELL IN FUTURE PHYSICS STUDIES.

FAQ

Q: WHAT IS THE PRIMARY DIFFERENCE BETWEEN LINEAR AND ROTATIONAL MOTION THAT MAKES UNIT 6 CHALLENGING?

A: THE PRIMARY DIFFERENCE LIES IN THE QUANTITIES USED TO DESCRIBE MOTION. LINEAR MOTION USES DISPLACEMENT, VELOCITY, AND ACCELERATION, WHILE ROTATIONAL MOTION USES ANGULAR DISPLACEMENT, ANGULAR VELOCITY, AND ANGULAR ACCELERATION. THE INTRODUCTION OF CONCEPTS LIKE TORQUE AND MOMENT OF INERTIA, WHICH DON'T HAVE DIRECT LINEAR EQUIVALENTS BEYOND FORCE AND MASS, ADDS ANOTHER LAYER OF COMPLEXITY THAT OFTEN MAKES UNIT 6 A SIGNIFICANT LEARNING CURVE FOR STUDENTS.

Q: HOW DOES TORQUE RELATE TO ANGULAR ACCELERATION, AND WHY IS THIS RELATIONSHIP IMPORTANT FOR SOLVING WORKSHEET PROBLEMS?

A: TORQUE IS THE ROTATIONAL EQUIVALENT OF FORCE; IT'S THE "TWIST" THAT CAUSES AN OBJECT TO CHANGE ITS ROTATIONAL SPEED. ANGULAR ACCELERATION IS THE RATE AT WHICH THE ROTATIONAL SPEED CHANGES. THE FUNDAMENTAL RELATIONSHIP IS NEWTON'S SECOND LAW FOR ROTATION: $\sum \tau = I \alpha$. THIS EQUATION IS VITAL BECAUSE IT DIRECTLY LINKS THE CAUSE OF ROTATIONAL ACCELERATION (TORQUE) TO THE EFFECT (ANGULAR ACCELERATION), MEDIATED BY

THE OBJECT'S RESISTANCE TO ROTATIONAL CHANGE (MOMENT OF INERTIA). MANY PROBLEMS ON THE WORKSHEET WILL REQUIRE YOU TO APPLY THIS LAW TO FIND AN UNKNOWN QUANTITY, WHETHER IT'S TORQUE, ACCELERATION, OR MOMENT OF INERTIA.

Q: WHAT IS ANGULAR MOMENTUM, AND IN WHAT SITUATIONS SHOULD I CONSIDER ITS CONSERVATION?

A: ANGULAR MOMENTUM (L) IS THE ROTATIONAL EQUIVALENT OF LINEAR MOMENTUM AND IS A MEASURE OF AN OBJECT'S TENDENCY TO CONTINUE ROTATING. IT'S CALCULATED AS $L = I\omega$. YOU SHOULD CONSIDER THE CONSERVATION OF ANGULAR MOMENTUM WHENEVER THE PROBLEM SPECIFIES THAT THERE ARE NO EXTERNAL TORQUES ACTING ON THE SYSTEM, OR WHEN THE NET EXTERNAL TORQUE IS NEGLIGIBLE. THIS PRINCIPLE IS OFTEN APPLIED IN SCENARIOS INVOLVING SPINNING OBJECTS WHERE MASS DISTRIBUTION CHANGES, LIKE A SKATER PULLING IN THEIR ARMS, OR IN ASTRONOMICAL CONTEXTS.

Q: ARE THERE SPECIFIC FORMULAS FOR MOMENT OF INERTIA THAT I SHOULD MEMORIZE FOR THE PHYSICS UNIT 6 WORKSHEET?

A: YES, WHILE THE CONCEPT OF MOMENT OF INERTIA IS GENERAL, THE SPECIFIC FORMULA DEPENDS ON THE SHAPE AND THE AXIS OF ROTATION. YOU SHOULD BE FAMILIAR WITH COMMON SHAPES LIKE THIN HOOPS ($I = MR^2$), SOLID DISKS ($I = \frac{1}{2}MR^2$), SOLID SPHERES ($I = \frac{2}{5}MR^2$), AND RODS. OFTEN, PROBLEMS WILL PROVIDE THESE FORMULAS, BUT UNDERSTANDING THEIR SIGNIFICANCE AND HOW THEY RELATE TO MASS DISTRIBUTION IS KEY.

Q: WHAT ARE THE COMMON UNITS FOR ANGULAR QUANTITIES IN PHYSICS, AND WHY IS USING RADIANS IMPORTANT?

A: THE COMMON UNITS FOR ANGULAR DISPLACEMENT ARE RADIANS (RAD) AND DEGREES ($^\circ$). FOR ANGULAR VELOCITY, IT'S TYPICALLY RADIANS PER SECOND (RAD/S). FOR ANGULAR ACCELERATION, IT'S RADIANS PER SECOND SQUARED (RAD/S 2). RADIANS ARE PREFERRED IN PHYSICS BECAUSE THEY SIMPLIFY MANY ROTATIONAL EQUATIONS, PARTICULARLY THOSE INVOLVING CALCULUS AND TRIGONOMETRIC FUNCTIONS, BY MAKING THEM DIMENSIONALLY CONSISTENT AND INDEPENDENT OF THE SIZE OF THE ANGLE UNIT. FOR EXAMPLE, FORMULAS LIKE ARC LENGTH ($s = r\theta$) AND TANGENTIAL VELOCITY ($v_t = r\omega$) ARE DERIVED ASSUMING θ IS IN RADIANS.

Q: WHEN SOLVING PROBLEMS INVOLVING ROTATIONAL MOTION, HOW CAN I ENSURE I'M USING THE CORRECT KINEMATIC EQUATION?

A: TO CHOOSE THE CORRECT KINEMATIC EQUATION, IDENTIFY THE VARIABLES GIVEN IN THE PROBLEM AND THE VARIABLE YOU NEED TO FIND. THEN, LOOK FOR THE EQUATION THAT RELATES THESE VARIABLES AND DOES NOT INCLUDE THE UNKNOWN VARIABLE YOU AREN'T GIVEN. FOR EXAMPLE, IF YOU HAVE INITIAL ANGULAR VELOCITY, ANGULAR ACCELERATION, AND TIME, AND YOU NEED TO FIND ANGULAR DISPLACEMENT, YOU WOULD USE $\Delta\theta = \omega_i t + \frac{1}{2}\alpha t^2$ BECAUSE IT CONTAINS $\Delta\theta$, ω_i , t , AND α , BUT NOT THE FINAL ANGULAR VELOCITY ω_f .
