For example, the distance an object travels over time can be described by a function of time. DIFFERENTIAL CALCULUS IN PHYSICS: THE STUDY OF INSTANTANEOUS CHANGE

ACCELERATION DESCRIBES HOW THE VELOCITY IS CHANGING – WHETHER IT'S SPEEDING UP, SLOWING DOWN, OR CHANGING DIRECTION. THINK ABOUT A CAR ACCELERATING FROM A STOPLIGHT; THE RATE AT WHICH ITS SPEED INCREASES IS ITS ACCELERATION, A DIRECT OUTPUT OF DIFFERENTIATION.

FORCE AND MOMENTUM

DIFFERENTIAL CALCULUS ALSO PLAYS A VITAL ROLE IN UNDERSTANDING FORCES AND MOMENTUM. NEWTON'S SECOND LAW OF MOTION, OFTEN STATED AS $F=ma$, CAN BE EXPRESSED MORE FUNDAMENTALLY USING CALCULUS. MOMENTUM, DEFINED AS MASS TIMES VELOCITY ($p = mv$), IS A CRUCIAL CONCEPT. THE NET FORCE ACTING ON AN OBJECT IS EQUAL TO THE RATE OF CHANGE OF ITS MOMENTUM WITH RESPECT TO TIME ($F = dp/dt$). FOR AN OBJECT WITH CONSTANT MASS, THIS SIMPLIFIES TO $F = m(dv/dt)$, WHICH IS $F = ma$. THIS DEMONSTRATES HOW CALCULUS ALLOWS US TO EXPRESS FUNDAMENTAL PHYSICAL LAWS IN THEIR MOST GENERAL AND POWERFUL FORMS, CAPABLE OF HANDLING SITUATIONS WHERE MASS MIGHT NOT BE CONSTANT, SUCH AS IN ROCKET PROPULSION.

RATES OF REACTION AND FLOW

BEYOND MECHANICS, DIFFERENTIAL CALCULUS IS INDISPENSABLE IN OTHER AREAS OF PHYSICS. IN THERMODYNAMICS AND PHYSICAL CHEMISTRY, IT'S USED TO DESCRIBE THE RATES OF CHEMICAL REACTIONS AND HEAT TRANSFER. FOR INSTANCE, THE RATE AT WHICH HEAT FLOWS FROM A WARMER OBJECT TO A COOLER ONE IS OFTEN PROPORTIONAL TO THE TEMPERATURE DIFFERENCE, A RELATIONSHIP BEAUTIFULLY DESCRIBED BY A DIFFERENTIAL EQUATION. SIMILARLY, THE SPEED AT WHICH A CHEMICAL REACTION PROCEEDS CAN BE MODELED USING DERIVATIVES, HELPING US UNDERSTAND HOW CONCENTRATIONS OF REACTANTS AND PRODUCTS CHANGE OVER TIME.

INTEGRAL CALCULUS IN PHYSICS: SUMMING UP INFINITESIMAL CONTRIBUTIONS

INTEGRAL CALCULUS, ON THE OTHER HAND, IS CONCERNED WITH ACCUMULATION. WHILE DIFFERENTIATION BREAKS THINGS DOWN INTO INFINITESIMAL PIECES TO FIND RATES OF CHANGE, INTEGRATION SUMS UP THESE INFINITESIMAL PIECES TO FIND A TOTAL QUANTITY. DISPLACEMENT FROM VELOCITY

JUST AS DIFFERENTIATION OF POSITION GIVES VELOCITY, INTEGRATION OF VELOCITY WITH RESPECT TO TIME GIVES US DISPLACEMENT. IF YOU KNOW THE VELOCITY OF AN OBJECT AT EVERY INSTANT, YOU CAN INTEGRATE THAT VELOCITY FUNCTION OVER A TIME INTERVAL TO FIND THE TOTAL DISTANCE TRAVELED OR THE NET CHANGE IN POSITION DURING THAT INTERVAL. IMAGINE PLOTTING AN OBJECT'S VELOCITY OVER TIME; THE AREA UNDER THAT CURVE REPRESENTS THE TOTAL DISPLACEMENT. THIS IS A POWERFUL CONCEPT FOR CALCULATING HOW FAR AN OBJECT WILL TRAVEL, EVEN IF ITS SPEED IS CONSTANTLY CHANGING.

WORK AND ENERGY

IN MECHANICS, INTEGRAL CALCULUS IS ESSENTIAL FOR CALCULATING WORK DONE BY A VARIABLE FORCE AND FOR UNDERSTANDING THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN WORK AND ENERGY. WORK IS DEFINED AS FORCE APPLIED OVER A DISTANCE. IF THE FORCE IS NOT CONSTANT, WE MUST INTEGRATE THE FORCE FUNCTION OVER THE PATH OF MOTION TO FIND THE TOTAL WORK DONE. THIS IS WHERE THE INTEGRAL SIGN ($\int$) COMES INTO PLAY, SIGNIFYING THE SUMMATION OF INFINITELY MANY TINY CONTRIBUTIONS OF FORCE ACTING OVER INFINITESIMALLY SMALL DISTANCES. UNDERSTANDING WORK IS FUNDAMENTAL TO UNDERSTANDING ENERGY, WHICH IS THE CAPACITY TO DO WORK.

MASS AND CENTER OF MASS

INTEGRAL CALCULUS IS ALSO USED TO CALCULATE THE TOTAL MASS OF AN OBJECT WITH VARIABLE DENSITY OR TO FIND THE CENTER OF MASS OF A CONTINUOUS OBJECT. FOR A ONE-DIMENSIONAL ROD WITH A DENSITY THAT VARIES ALONG ITS LENGTH, WE INTEGRATE THE DENSITY FUNCTION MULTIPLIED BY AN INFINITESIMAL LENGTH ELEMENT ($dm = \rho(x)dx$) TO FIND THE TOTAL MASS. SIMILARLY, FINDING THE CENTER OF MASS INVOLVES INTEGRATING THE PRODUCT OF POSITION AND MASS ELEMENT OVER THE ENTIRE OBJECT, DIVIDED BY THE TOTAL MASS.

KEY APPLICATIONS OF CALCULUS IN PHYSICS

THE APPLICATIONS OF CALCULUS IN PHYSICS ARE VAST AND PERMEATE NEARLY EVERY SUB-DISCIPLINE. IT'S NOT AN EXAGGERATION TO SAY THAT MODERN PHYSICS WOULD BE UNIMAGINABLE WITHOUT IT.

ELECTROMAGNETISM

IN ELECTROMAGNETISM, CALCULUS IS FUNDAMENTAL. MAXWELL'S EQUATIONS, WHICH UNIFY ELECTRICITY AND MAGNETISM, ARE EXPRESSED AS A SET OF PARTIAL DIFFERENTIAL EQUATIONS. THESE EQUATIONS DESCRIBE HOW ELECTRIC AND MAGNETIC FIELDS ARE GENERATED AND INTERACT WITH EACH OTHER AND WITH CHARGES AND CURRENTS. CONCEPTS LIKE ELECTRIC FLUX, MAGNETIC FLUX, ELECTRIC POTENTIAL, AND CURRENT DENSITY ALL RELY HEAVILY ON DIFFERENTIAL AND INTEGRAL CALCULUS FOR THEIR PRECISE FORMULATION AND APPLICATION. FOR EXAMPLE, GAUSS'S LAW FOR ELECTRICITY RELATES THE ELECTRIC FIELD TO THE CHARGE ENCLOSED WITHIN A SURFACE, REQUIRING INTEGRATION.

QUANTUM MECHANICS

QUANTUM MECHANICS, THE THEORY THAT DESCRIBES THE BEHAVIOR OF MATTER AND ENERGY AT THE ATOMIC AND SUBATOMIC LEVELS, IS STEEPED IN CALCULUS. THE SCHRÖDINGER EQUATION, THE CENTRAL EQUATION OF NON-RELATIVISTIC QUANTUM MECHANICS, IS A PARTIAL DIFFERENTIAL EQUATION THAT DESCRIBES HOW THE QUANTUM STATE OF A PHYSICAL SYSTEM CHANGES OVER TIME. WAVE FUNCTIONS, WHICH REPRESENT THE PROBABILITY AMPLITUDE OF FINDING A PARTICLE IN A CERTAIN STATE, ARE HANDLED USING CALCULUS. CALCULATING PROBABILITIES, EXPECTATION VALUES OF PHYSICAL OBSERVABLES, AND UNDERSTANDING THE EVOLUTION OF QUANTUM SYSTEMS ALL NECESSITATE ADVANCED CALCULUS TECHNIQUES.

FLUID DYNAMICS

UNDERSTANDING PHENOMENA LIKE TURBULENCE, LIFT ON AN AIRPLANE WING, OR THE FLOW OF BLOOD IN ARTERIES REQUIRES SOPHISTICATED APPLICATION OF INTEGRAL AND DIFFERENTIAL CALCULUS TO MODEL AND PREDICT FLUID BEHAVIOR.

THERMODYNAMICS AND STATISTICAL MECHANICS

IN THERMODYNAMICS, THE RELATIONSHIPS BETWEEN HEAT, WORK, TEMPERATURE, AND ENERGY ARE OFTEN DESCRIBED USING DIFFERENTIAL EQUATIONS. FOR INSTANCE, THE FIRST LAW OF THERMODYNAMICS, WHICH DEALS WITH THE CONSERVATION OF ENERGY, CAN BE EXPRESSED IN DIFFERENTIAL FORM. UNIVERSALITY: CALCULUS PROVIDES A UNIFIED FRAMEWORK. THE SAME MATHEMATICAL TOOLS CAN BE USED TO DESCRIBE THE MOTION OF A THROWN BALL, THE ORBIT OF A PLANET, AND THE FLOW OF CURRENT IN A WIRE. THIS UNIVERSALITY IS WHAT MAKES IT SO POWERFUL.

FOUNDATION FOR ADVANCED STUDY: ANY STUDENT PURSUING HIGHER EDUCATION IN PHYSICS, ENGINEERING, OR RELATED FIELDS WILL FIND CALCULUS TO BE THE BEDROCK UPON WHICH MORE ADVANCED CONCEPTS ARE BUILT. IT'S THE GATEWAY TO UNDERSTANDING FIELDS LIKE GENERAL RELATIVITY, QUANTUM FIELD THEORY, AND COSMOLOGY.
