THE LITTLE ALBERT EXPERIMENT CONDUCTED BY JOHN B. WATSON AND ROSALIE RAYNER DEMONSTRATED CLASSICAL CONDITIONING IN HUMANS. THE STUDY INVOLVED A YOUNG CHILD WHO WAS CONDITIONED TO FEAR A WHITE RAT. THIS CASE STUDY WAS PIVOTAL IN ILLUSTRATING HOW EMOTIONAL RESPONSES COULD BE LEARNED AND UNLEARNED, LAYING THE GROUNDWORK FOR BEHAVIORISM IN PSYCHOLOGY.

ANNA O.

ANNA O., THE PSEUDONYM FOR BERTHA PAPPENHEIM, WAS A PATIENT OF SIGMUND FREUD AND JOSEF BREUER. HER CASE IS SIGNIFICANT IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF PSYCHOANALYSIS, SHOWCASING THE IMPORTANCE OF TALKING THERAPIES. THE EXPLORATION OF HER SYMPTOMS LED TO THE FORMULATION OF THE "TALKING CURE," WHICH UNDERScoreD THE PSYCHOLOGICAL ROOTS OF PHYSICAL AILMENTS.

ETHICAL CONSIDERATIONS IN CASE STUDIES
