UNDERSTANDING PSYCHOLOGY ADJUNCT INSTRUCTOR JOBS

EDUCATIONAL REQUIREMENTS

THE EDUCATIONAL QUALIFICATIONS FOR ADJUNCT INSTRUCTORS CAN VARY SIGNIFICANTLY. GENERALLY, THE FOLLOWING ARE EXPECTED:

- A MASTER'S DEGREE IN PSYCHOLOGY OR A RELATED FIELD FOR MOST POSITIONS.
- A DOCTORAL DEGREE FOR MORE ADVANCED TEACHING ROLES, PARTICULARLY AT FOUR-YEAR INSTITUTIONS.

BENEFITS OF BEING AN ADJUNCT INSTRUCTOR

WORKING AS AN ADJUNCT INSTRUCTOR CAN OPEN DOORS TO NETWORKING OPPORTUNITIES WITHIN THE ACADEMIC AND PROFESSIONAL PSYCHOLOGY COMMUNITIES. INSTRUCTORS CAN CONNECT WITH FELLOW EDUCATORS, RESEARCHERS, AND STUDENTS, POTENTIALLY LEADING TO COLLABORATIONS OR JOB OPPORTUNITIES IN THE FUTURE.

CHALLENGES FACED BY ADJUNCT INSTRUCTORS

NETWORK WITHIN ACADEMIC CIRCLES

PREPARE A STRONG APPLICATION

WHEN APPLYING FOR ADJUNCT POSITIONS, TAILOR YOUR APPLICATION MATERIALS, INCLUDING YOUR CV AND COVER LETTER, TO HIGHLIGHT YOUR RELEVANT EXPERIENCE, TEACHING PHILOSOPHY, AND ENTHUSIASM FOR THE SUBJECT MATTER. BE SURE TO SHOWCASE ANY INNOVATIVE TEACHING METHODS YOU MAY HAVE EMPLOYED IN THE PAST.

CURRENT JOB MARKET AND SALARY EXPECTATIONS
