CLINICAL PSYCHOLOGIST

CLINICAL PSYCHOLOGISTS DIAGNOSE AND TREAT MENTAL ILLNESSES AND EMOTIONAL DISTURBANCES. THEY WORK WITH INDIVIDUALS, COUPLES, AND FAMILIES TO PROVIDE THERAPY AND SUPPORT. THIS ROLE OFTEN REQUIRES A DOCTORAL DEGREE IN PSYCHOLOGY AND LICENSURE TO PRACTICE. CLINICAL PSYCHOLOGISTS MAY SPECIALIZE IN AREAS SUCH AS CHILD PSYCHOLOGY,

SUBSTANCE ABUSE, OR TRAUMA.

COUNSELING PSYCHOLOGIST

COUNSELING PSYCHOLOGISTS FOCUS ON HELPING INDIVIDUALS COPE WITH LIFE TRANSITIONS, RELATIONSHIP ISSUES, AND PERSONAL CHALLENGES. UNLIKE CLINICAL PSYCHOLOGISTS, THEY OFTEN WORK WITH CLIENTS WHO DO NOT HAVE SEVERE PSYCHOLOGICAL DISORDERS. COUNSELING PSYCHOLOGISTS TYPICALLY HOLD A MASTER'S OR DOCTORAL DEGREE AND ARE TRAINED IN VARIOUS THERAPEUTIC TECHNIQUES.

SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGIST

SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGISTS WORK WITHIN EDUCATIONAL SETTINGS TO SUPPORT STUDENTS' MENTAL HEALTH AND ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE. THEY ASSESS LEARNING DIFFICULTIES, PROVIDE COUNSELING, AND COLLABORATE WITH TEACHERS AND PARENTS TO CREATE SUPPORTIVE LEARNING ENVIRONMENTS. A SPECIALIST OR DOCTORAL DEGREE IN SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGY IS USUALLY REQUIRED FOR THIS ROLE.

INDUSTRIAL-ORGANIZATIONAL PSYCHOLOGIST

INDUSTRIAL-ORGANIZATIONAL PSYCHOLOGISTS APPLY PSYCHOLOGICAL PRINCIPLES TO WORKPLACE ISSUES, FOCUSING ON IMPROVING EMPLOYEE PERFORMANCE, SATISFACTION, AND WELL-BEING. THEY MAY CONDUCT RESEARCH, DEVELOP TRAINING PROGRAMS, OR CONSULT ON ORGANIZATIONAL POLICIES. A MASTER'S OR DOCTORAL DEGREE IN PSYCHOLOGY, OFTEN WITH A FOCUS ON BUSINESS, IS TYPICALLY NECESSARY.

RESEARCH PSYCHOLOGIST

RESEARCH PSYCHOLOGISTS CONDUCT STUDIES TO ADVANCE THE UNDERSTANDING OF HUMAN BEHAVIOR AND MENTAL PROCESSES. THEY OFTEN WORK IN ACADEMIC OR CORPORATE SETTINGS, PUBLISHING THEIR FINDINGS IN SCIENTIFIC JOURNALS. A PH.D. IS USUALLY REQUIRED FOR THIS CAREER, ALONG WITH A STRONG FOUNDATION IN RESEARCH METHODS.

EDUCATIONAL REQUIREMENTS FOR A CAREER IN PSYCHOLOGY

A: YOU CAN SPECIALIZE IN PSYCHOLOGY BY PURSUING ADVANCED DEGREES OR CERTIFICATIONS IN SPECIFIC AREAS, SUCH AS CLINICAL PSYCHOLOGY, CHILD PSYCHOLOGY, OR NEUROPSYCHOLOGY. ADDITIONALLY, GAINING EXPERIENCE THROUGH INTERNSHIPS AND FOCUSED RESEARCH CAN HELP YOU CARVE OUT A SPECIALIZATION.
