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WHAT IS A P-VALUE?

A P-VALUE IS A NUMBER BETWEEN 0 AND 1. A SMALLER P-VALUE INDICATES STRONGER EVIDENCE AGAINST THE NULL HYPOTHESIS. FOR INSTANCE, A P-VALUE OF 0.05 IS OFTEN USED AS A THRESHOLD FOR STATISTICAL SIGNIFICANCE, INDICATING THAT THERE IS ONLY A 5% PROBABILITY THAT THE OBSERVED RESULTS COULD OCCUR BY CHANCE. HOWEVER, IT IS ESSENTIAL TO NOTE THAT THE P-VALUE ALONE DOES NOT MEASURE THE SIZE OF AN EFFECT OR THE IMPORTANCE OF A RESULT; IT ONLY INDICATES THE EVIDENCE AGAINST THE NULL HYPOTHESIS.

UNDERSTANDING STATISTICAL SIGNIFICANCE

STATISTICAL SIGNIFICANCE IS A KEY CONCEPT THAT IS CLOSELY RELATED TO THE P-VALUE. WHEN RESEARCHERS CONDUCT EXPERIMENTS, THEY OFTEN WANT TO KNOW WHETHER THEIR RESULTS ARE STATISTICALLY SIGNIFICANT OR IF THEY OCCURRED BY RANDOM CHANCE. HOWEVER, IF THE P-VALUE IS GREATER THAN 0.05, THE EVIDENCE IS INSUFFICIENT TO REJECT THE NULL HYPOTHESIS, INDICATING THAT ANY OBSERVED EFFECT

MAY BE DUE TO CHANCE.

THE IMPORTANCE OF SETTING A SIGNIFICANCE LEVEL

BEFORE CONDUCTING A STUDY, RESEARCHERS MUST DETERMINE THE LEVEL OF SIGNIFICANCE THEY WILL USE, WHICH IS THE THRESHOLD AT WHICH THEY WILL REJECT THE NULL HYPOTHESIS. COMMON SIGNIFICANCE LEVELS INCLUDE:

- **0.05:** 5% CHANCE OF INCORRECTLY REJECTING THE NULL HYPOTHESIS.
- **0.01:** 1% CHANCE OF MAKING AN ERROR.
- **0.001:** 0.1% CHANCE OF FALSE POSITIVES.

SETTING A SIGNIFICANCE LEVEL IS CRUCIAL AS IT IMPACTS THE CONCLUSIONS DRAWN FROM THE RESEARCH. A LOWER SIGNIFICANCE LEVEL (E.G., 0.01) MEANS THAT RESEARCHERS ARE MORE STRINGENT IN REQUIRING STRONGER EVIDENCE BEFORE REJECTING THE NULL HYPOTHESIS, WHICH CAN REDUCE THE LIKELIHOOD OF FALSE POSITIVES.

HOW IS THE P-VALUE CALCULATED?

- **P-VALUE IS THE ONLY MEASURE OF INTEREST:** SOLELY RELYING ON P-VALUES CAN BE MISLEADING. RESEARCHERS SHOULD ALSO CONSIDER EFFECT SIZES AND CONFIDENCE INTERVALS TO GAIN A MORE COMPREHENSIVE VIEW OF THEIR RESULTS.
